Telehandler Training Courses Nanaimo - The employer has the responsibility to make certain that their employees are trained to work proficiently using telehandler equipment. The personnel must be assessed for their ability to use the machinery. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that employees get the necessary level of ability. The responsibility level of the individual should be considered when training is offered. Effective training would solve whichever deficiencies in the understanding, knowledge and skills of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training may be undertaken through in-house session or by engaging the services of an external training provider. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine if the learning goals have been met or not.

Local, federal and state/provincial regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not address such subject matters as the lifting of people, the lifting of suspended loads, the use of rotating equipment or utilizing different attachments. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work location.

Maintenance and Inspection

Like any machine, a telehandler requires effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably would suffer wear over time. Right maintenance is important to ensuring safe utilization of the telehandler machinery. Checks and inspections are vital to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators need to have machine-specific training in order to monitor, prevent and rectify problems connected with deterioration, damage and wear. Workers require experience and competence in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer should be seriously viewed and complied with, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machine share the responsibility for making certain that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is normally carried out by the telehandler owner while pre-use checks are usually carried out by the user.
