Forklift License Nanaimo - Acquiring a forklift certification or forklift license in North America will require the trainee to do classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The provincial, federal and state regulatory bodies are responsible for the licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators. Operators can obtain a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machinery which is designed with various options, like for example sit-down and stand-up models, propane and electric versions, and a wide variety of sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of employees. Operator training courses are usually individualized in order to deal with the specific uses and types for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck inside a warehouse surroundings would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered forklift within a shipyard. The various lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and industries. Regulatory standards, hence, have a tendency not to focus on specific program requirements but rather on the results of individual training courses.

On the job training that is offered by the employer is the most common method of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who provides this method of certification is required to offer classroom sessions and practical training on machinery at their place of work. Employers could choose to train personnel on every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The program incorporates forklift operation procedures, forklift maintenance, safety procedures and company policies. Topics specific to the worksite, like for example hazardous materials or conditions, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and utilize every kind of forklift on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually needs an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

Typically, an employer-provided certification would not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Receiving a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a forklift for that employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an important factor of the lift truck license training, even though the specifics of the safety training will be dependent upon the machinery being utilized. Certain safety issues would vary for each industry and employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training might have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for instance in marine and offshore uses.
