A crane operator for example needs to undergo an in-depth training course which cover various certification programs prior to being able to operate an overhead crane. Various heavy machine truck drivers on the other hand may only need some other site specific training as well as their CDL. The in-depth training which follows certain equipment is essential since much of the work happens in hazardous scenarios and dangerous scenes so the operator must be able to ensure a safe working environment at all times. The safety training is essential as well as the communications training that helps the crew on the ground be able to communicate with the operator at all times.

Because of the extreme environments these machines work under, they are often put under incredible strain regularly. This means there are a lot of heavy equipment jobs available for the repair and maintenance of the machinery. Heavy machine operators are really skilled workers who can troubleshoot, repair and diagnose heavy equipment in a work shop or on site. Mechanics must be ready to transport their tools to a job site and carry out maintenance and repair in different conditions.

Sometimes it could be possible for delivery drivers to operate equipment with just a simple CDL. Nonetheless, various jobs will require more specific training. Drivers that need to handle large machinery or parts for construction projects will require the heavy machine operator to complete further training. Usually, the drivers operate with chaperone vehicles that are driven by trained drivers. These chaperone vehicles typically escort the delivery truck to its destination.
